School & Youth Etiquette

The following guidelines have been designed to protect our plant collections and provide all guests with a meaningful experience. Please be mindful that the Botanical Garden is a museum of living plants, not a park or a playground. Please do not bring sports equipment into the garden. The Botanical Garden depends on you to be responsible garden stewards. Please take a few moments to review our behavior guidelines for visiting school and youth groups. Guests that do not comply with these guidelines may be asked to leave with no refund.

- For everyone's safety, please walk wherever you go.
- Help protect our plants and yourselves by remaining on the paths, not picking flowers, walking in flower beds or climbing trees.
- Touching plants is permitted, as long as gentle hands are used.
- Please leave all fallen leaves, flowers and other plant materials on the ground.
- Please respect artwork and sculptures located throughout the gardens by not touching, climbing, hanging on or otherwise disturbing the artwork.
- Do not play in or toss coins into water features.
- If you notice litter, be a good garden steward and dispose of the litter in the nearest trash or recycling receptacle.
- Use of the elevator is reserved for individuals requiring accommodation. Please instruct students to use stairs if possible.
- Please come dressed for the weather as programs may take place inside or out, rain or shine. Shirts and shoes are required at all times.
- For the safety of all students, chaperones are asked to stay with their assigned group for the duration of the fieldtrip.
- Students are asked to respect Botanical Garden staff by putting away electronic devices.
- Teachers and chaperones are requested to use phones <u>exclusively</u> for emergency purposes.
- Gardens are a place for people to find peace and serenity—please talk softly.
- Pictures of students may be taken by staff/volunteers during the program to be used in marketing/advertising materials. If you do not want students to be photographed, please let the staff know.
